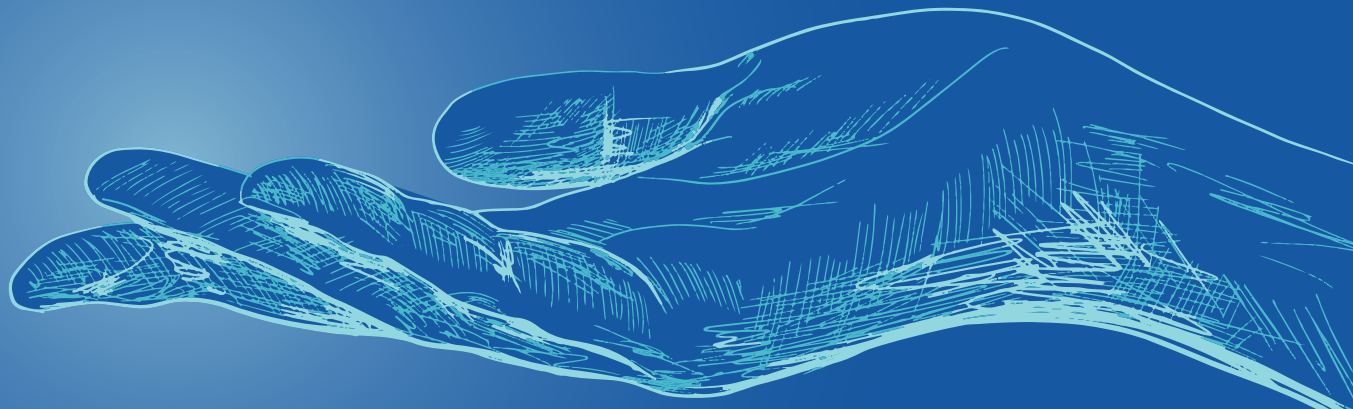

For the Foundation last year didn't begin on the 1st of January, rather on February 24-th.

It was a day that changed all our lives. As Ukrainians, we stood up to protect our land and our future. As representatives of the charitable foundation, we instantly rearranged our plans and priorities for the year and immediately shifted our projects and operations to provide assistance to all that needed it.

In the morning, we cooked stews, then we met the buses transporting the evacuated residents of Mariupol, Soledar, Kherson or Druzhkivka. Over the course of the afternoon we systematically expanded our operations to service additional areas. On weekends, we wove camouflage nets, made trench candles and donated blood. We also discussed optimization of processes at work meetings, renewal of the Supervisory Board of the Foundation, cooperation with international donors and new community restoration projects.

The work of our charitable foundation did not stop, even during air raids, blackouts or waves of mass missile attacks. We have learned how to channel our anger into important projects to assist the military, support and encourage micro-entrepreneurship in communities and ensure food security and medicinal supplies across the regions of Ukraine. Despite all the challenges thrown up by the war we were able to design and launch even more community projects in 2022 than in any previous year.

We have tripled our allocated budget for social and charity projects, quadrupled the number of partnerships, and expanded the scope of our projects so that they reached seven times more people than they did in 2021.

The war has been a catalyst for our operations – accelerating the rollout of our support networks across Ukraine and beyond. Our successes of the past year have demonstrated that we can do much more than we had imagined prior to the invasion. Our Foundation

is setting new ambitious goals, and we all hope that next year we will be reporting on them in a free, independent Ukraine!

Our mission, which began on that fateful February day continues and we already have a lot to be proud of. Please read on to find out what exactly the Foundation has been working on over the past year.

In 2022, I realized an important thing: previously, my plans for the coming year, or summarizing the results of the prior year, were given more easily. Russia's full-scale war against Ukraine has radically changed the perception of personal life, the understanding of the meanings of «State» and «Ukrainians», the feeling of responsibility for relatives, the team, the community, the state and, certainly, for the work we are doing.

Nowadays I often reminisce my parents, grandparents, who survived and went through famines and wars, and who, when they heard us or someone close to us complaining about life's problems, they said the not entirely understandable phrase that time... everything can be survived, corrected, most importantly, so that there would be no war...»

The factor of war has become decisive for our actions and plans. The words «unity», «strength», «sustainability», «mutual help», "care" have acquired new meanings and, mainly, actions.

The understanding of these words suffered by elders began to come in 2014, and we realized their true meaning on the winter morning of February 24, 2022.

The MHP company has showed its resilience every day, at most helping the defenders of the state to persevere and go to our Victory. Therefore, the "MHP-Community" charitable foundation, with the support of businesses, benefactors, and donors, was supposed to provide the maximum possible care and help to all who needed it, especially in the first weeks and months of the war: military, civilians, settlers.

Moreover, in the unity of the business strength of MHP enterprises, other benefactors and the «MHP-Community» Charitable Foundation, we managed to survive. The foundation has provided charitable and humanitarian aid with food, household goods, medical equipment, vehicles and building materials, military ammunition and special equipment. We have supported military, civilian adults and children, doctors and patients of medical institutions, social institutions.

After the Armed Forces of Ukraine liberated Kyiv, Sumy, and Chernihiv regions from the occupiers, the activities of the Foundation became even more comprehensive, efficient and professional.

The Foundation has resumed work on the projects it has traditionally dealt with. However, connections with new partners and benefactors, work on new projects, the need for which was dictated by the life of the state, communities, and citizens in conditions of martial law or the consequences of military actions, became extremely important.

The employees of the foundation fulfilled their mission worthily in the conditions of an extremely difficult, extraordinary year, thanks to the support of our business

partners, partners, benefactors, donors.

We have deep gratitude to all of them for unity, strength, stability, faith and mutual assistance.

Unfortunately, the war is going on. It largely determines the methods and directions of the Foundation's work in 2023 as well.

Having experience and desire, understanding the needs and expectations of the state, communities and citizens, **the «MHP-Community» Foundation should contribute to our Victory, the restoration of the state, the development of communities and citizens with its effective charitable activities.**

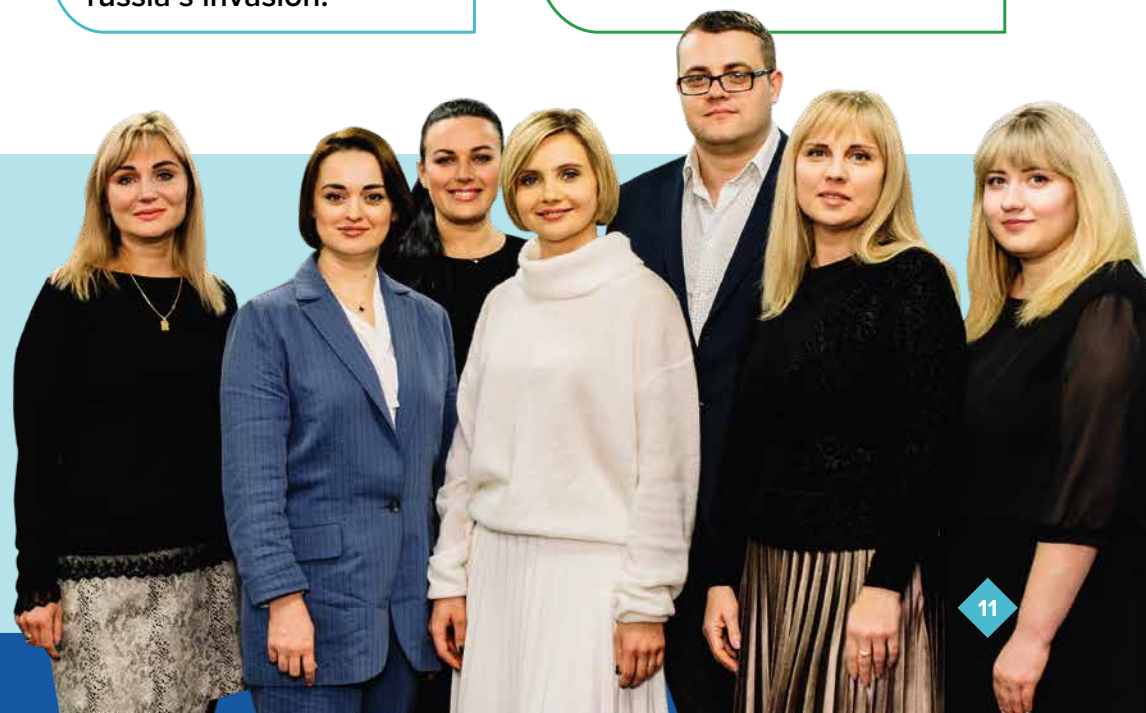
PUBLIC HEALTH

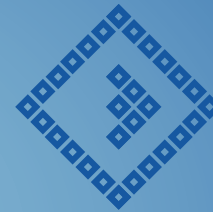

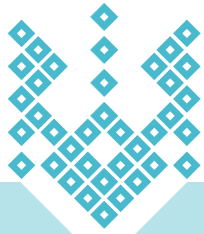

A unique initiative showcasing Ukrainian films to the country's defenders and tens of thousands of residents who live in settlements without cinemas. The initiative began on the 6th August 2022 and continues to this day. It consists of a number of parts including the dispatch of a special "movie car" to towns and villages across the country, roving technical support crews to assist with the screening of Ukrainian films screenings; arranging remote screenings in cooperation with local activists and at the request of military units and medical institutions.

Within the film tour, the organizers arrange numerous meetings with filmmakers, pre-premiere screenings of Ukrainian films for the military, including talks by their directors and opportunities to meet the actors and film crews behind the magic.

The main goal of the tour is to help invigorate self-identification and motivate Ukrainians to learn about their history and their shared culture through music.



A doctor for the village



A social health initiative which saw medical vehicles, specially equipped with reagents and medical equipment, visit small settlements across Ukraine. This provided local residents with the opportunity to consult an ophthalmologist, a therapist, conduct an ultrasound and ECG examination, check their blood sugar level, and receive proscriptioin medicines.

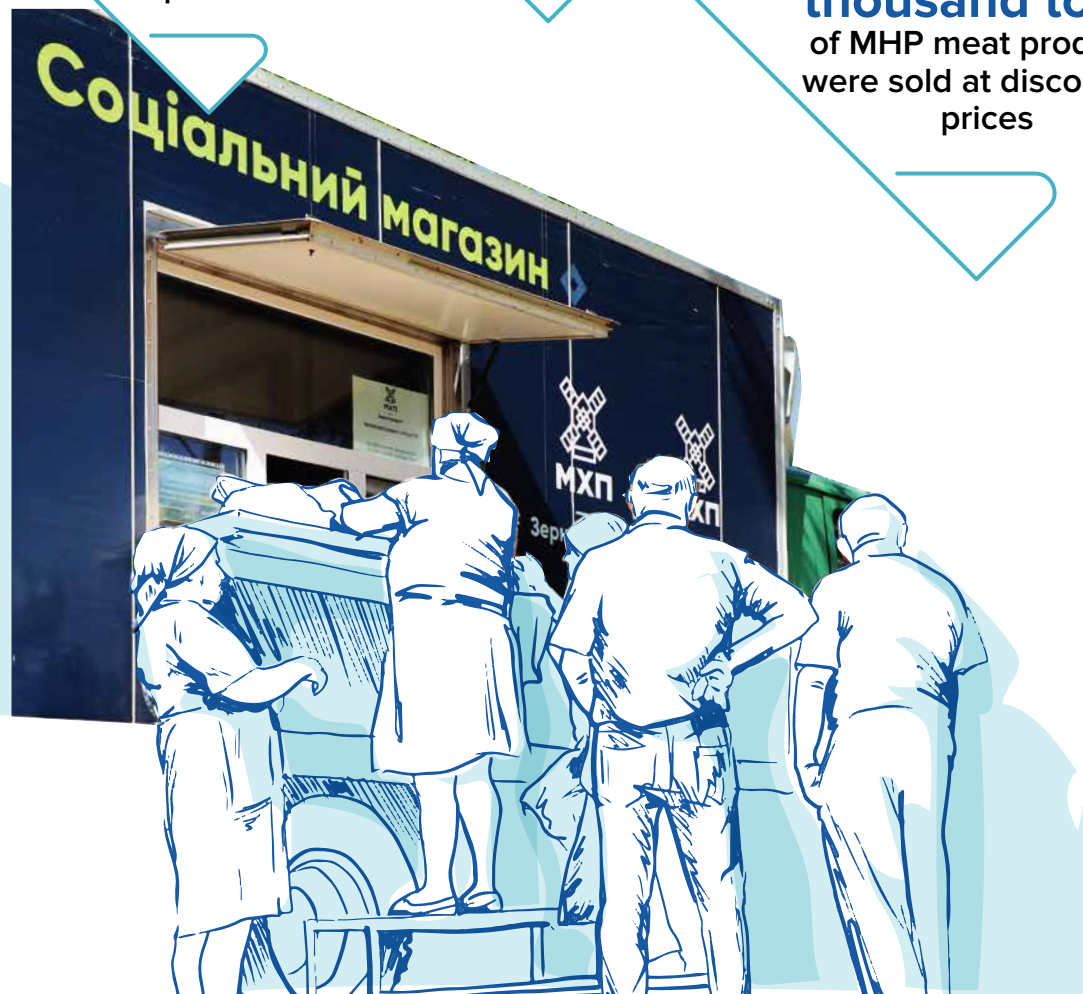

Partnership with the Embassy of Japan in Ukraine

Despite the challenges and tribulations of the war we were determined to continue our initiatives in local communities. We are glad that today, when the field of health care is of paramount importance, we can make a real difference through working with international partners. Thanks to financial assistance from the Embassy of Japan in Ukraine, through its «Kusanone» program, which has enabled us to purchase a modern ultrasound machine for the Trostyanetska hospital in Vinnytsia.

Common project with Ukrainian-Danish Youth House

On March 11, 2022, a Russian missile hit the Fun Hub Youth Center in Baryshivka, within the Kyiv region. A year prior, funds for the centre were provided by the Foundation through our "It's time to act, Ukraine!" competition. After the liberation of the Kyiv region, working with activists the Fpimdatopm began work to restore the Fun Hub and by the 4th November was fully operational.

The Youth Council of the Baryshiv OTG (United territorial community) together with the Foundation won a grant from the Ukrainian-Danish Youth House (totalling 240,766 UAH) for the restoration of the facility. Part of the hub was relocated with the facility now featuring a bomb shelter and the youth center is once again welcoming guests to its cultural, psychological and developmental events.



A common project with the Alliance for Public Health

Our Foundation won funding from a min-grant competition ran by the Synergy of Souls Public Organization, with financial support from the Alliance for Public Health. With the

we received from the grant we bought and supplied a range of food products with the help of our partners:

- ◆ PrJSC (private joint stock company) «Oril-Leader» donated 700 kg of poultry meat,
- ◆ MHP organized the delivery of products and poultry meat to Dnipropetrovsk region,
- ◆ Kytaihorod local community packed everything into food kits which we distributed to those that urgently needed them



Common project EU4CSOs Emergency Actions

Almost 3,000 internally displaced persons currently reside in the Ladyzhynska urban community in Vinnytsia region. Some are sheltering with relatives, some are renting apartments. Unfortunately, there are those who do not have family to stay with an lack the funds to pay for rented accommodation. The community found buildings for such people in the villages of Zaozerne and Vasylivka, enabling IPS to settle there and repaired their new homes. The local community asked our foundation to help supply the IDPs settling there with household appliances, beds, and kitchen utensils which we were delighted to provide.

We applied for and received a grant from the EU4CSOs Emergency Actions project, financed by the European Union, which was utilized via the «Network of 100 Percent Life of Rivne» (donor contribution 355,000 UAH).



The results of the Common project:

- ◆ The purchase of household appliances and other necessities to the sum of of 408,740 UAH,
- ◆ Furnishing housing for 30 IPDs in Vasylivka village and 30 in Zaozerny village,
- ◆ The donated equipment has been transferred to the balance sheet of «Lajitloservice»,
- ◆ we have monitored the project at all stages.



A common project with Konwent Włosprący Samorządowej Polska-Ukraina

Our partner Konwent Włosprący Samorządowej Polska-Ukraina has allocated 82,000 UAH to the «MHP-Hromadi» foundation for the purchase of equipment for bomb shelters in the Poltava region. Following guidance from the State Emergency Service of Ukraine these shelters must be supplied with essential equipment including shovels, crowbars, axes, alongside saws to cut through wood and metal, to help remove debris and escape in the event of a direct hit.

The result of this international cooperation was the completion of shelters, to the standards of the State Emergency Service, in 9 communities across the Poltava region.

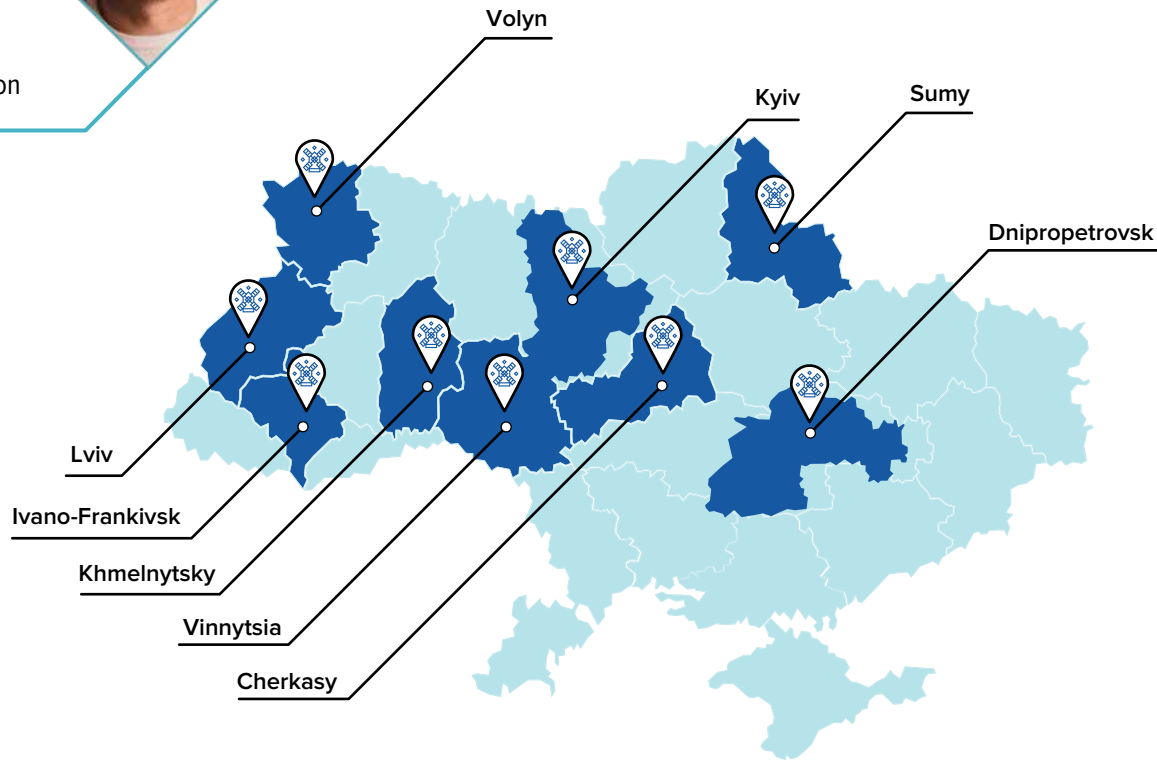

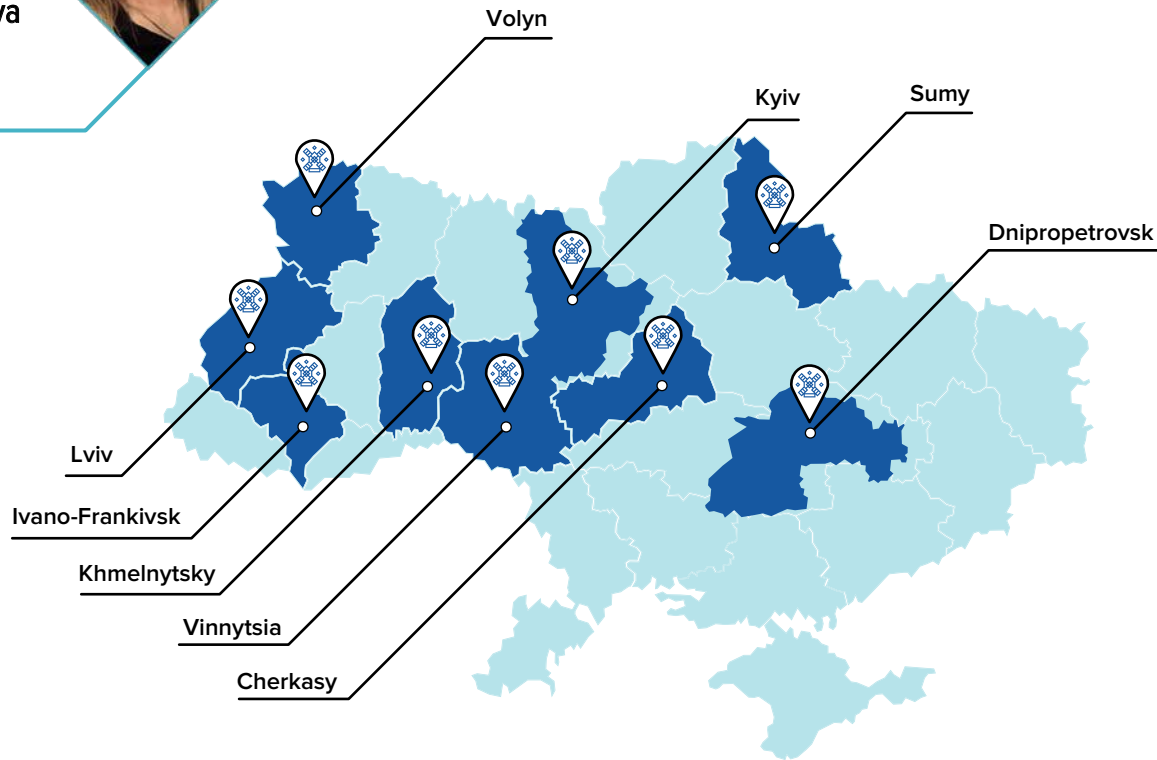
